Vienna Formula:
Blocs skillfully merged their ideas through the Vienna Formula, blending diverse clauses into one coherent draft resolution. The spirit of diplomacy and compromise was evident as delegates worked collectively to strengthen the document.



Line-by-Line Review:
In the final stage, the committee meticulously reviewed each clause. Delegates proposed minor edits, refined phrasing, and reached consensus on all major points—culminating in a unified and comprehensive resolution.

DAY 2



Vienna Formula

All the delegates made incredible amendments, demonstrating the research done by each and everyone, making excellent points for their amendments.



CONSENSUS REACHED

Several significant consensuses have been reached within the Model United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).



The idea that the best waste is the waste not generated, then the waste reused, then recycled, then finally disposed. For example UNEP's "Waste and Climate Change: Global Trends and Strategy Framework" mentions aligning waste management with the internationally recognised waste management hierarchy.

Equitable Access To Technological Advancement



The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC)

The UNHRC promotes and protects human rights globally, fostering equality, freedom and justice for inclusive, ethical and sustainable development.



Delegates discussed the widening digital divide, unequal access to innovation, and the role of Artificial Intelligence in enhancing medical facilities. Countries shared strategies and ideas for cooperation.



The Council focused on frameworks for digital equity, telemedicine, organ donation, and data protection. Delegates collaborated on resolutions promoting open access, education, and ethical innovation.



UNHRC PROCEEDINGS

Delegates of Belgium and China debated amazingly on organ donation and trafficking, discussing artificial organs and ensuring sufficient supply to prevent illegal trade.



The Delegates of DPRK and Germany held a spectacular debate on protecting people's privacy and safeguarding personal data in digital healthcare systems.



China and Qatar debated addressing global health disparities and promoting equal access to innovation through effective government policies.

Revolutionising Automation & Structural Unemployment



The session commenced with the General Speakers List, where delegates presented their national perspectives on achieving global economic stability.



Delegates then proceeded to form blocs based on shared fiscal priorities. The atmosphere was collaborative as nations discussed potential frameworks and began drafting working papers, development goals.



The day's proceedings reflected a spirit of cooperation, negotiation, and progress toward unified action. Delegates actively participated in every stage – from expressing national perspectives to refining the resolution.

Combating organised crime & Drug distribution



UNODC works to combat drugs, crime, corruption, and terrorism worldwide, it promotes - justice, rule of law, and health based approaches to drug and crime issue .



DAY 1

The session commenced with the general speakers list (GSL)

- The GSL is opened when debate starts.
- Delegates raise their placards to be added to the list.
- Each speaker gets a set time (usually 1-2 minutes).



DAY 2

Bloc formation in MUN means countries with similar views or goals join together to form a group (or "bloc") to work on resolutions and strategies.

- Delegates find others who share their stance on the issue.
- They discuss ideas, combine clauses, and draft resolutions together



UNODC PROCEEDINGS

Double Delegation

In double delegation, two students represent one country together in a committee. They share research, speeches, and duties like writing resolutions and debating. It encourages teamwork and helps delegates handle larger or more complex topics.

THE VIENNA FORMULA

The Vienna Formula at EAMUNC lets non-member countries and observers join the debate and share their views, but they can't vote on resolutions. It helps include more voices in discussions, just like in real UN meetings.



POI
(Point of Information)
POI is a question or brief interjection a delegate can offer to a speaker during their speech. Its purpose is to clarify, challenge, or seek more details about what the speaker is saying.

Through conflict, the committee has witnessed immense growth and unity towards a call for peace negotiations.




